The Lane Titan Athletic Programs had some successes in and out of the classroom during the Winter Term.

• The Women's Basketball Team finished 24-6 overall, and 13-1 in the Southern Region, claiming their 6th Southern Region title in the last 10 years. They had their 11th consecutive NWAACC Championship tournament appearance. The team Fall GPA was 3.382, with two ladies over 4.0. The only sophomore, Reed Levings, was on the NWAACC Sophomore All-

- Academic Sports Team (Winter Term) with a cumulative GPA of 3.32, and was second team all conference, as well as on the All-defensive team.
- Men's Basketball player, Daniel Ketchum, was also on the NWAACC Sophomore All-Academic Sports Team (Winter Term) with a cumulative GPA of 3.28
- Two Cross Country runners earned the NWAACC Fall Academic Leadership Award. Gylany Crossman had a 4.0 cumulative GPA and was an All-American at the NWAACC Cross Country Championships finishing second, while teammate Rachel Jensen had a 3.86 cumulative GPA and finished 9th at NWAACC Cross Country Championships. The Women's Cross Country team had a 3.967 team GPA, while the Men had a 3.308 team GPA.
