Lane's Associate Degree Registered Nursing program has sailed through their state accreditation visit. Although the official report will not be released until February, recommendations to the Oregon Board of Nursing on 11/28/2012 include the maximum accreditation period of eight years. There were no deficiencies in the site report but plenty of commendations including those for our Director of Nursing, Tricia Tully, our faculty and staff, our Librarian Jen Klaudinyi, our science faculty, our state of the art facilities and simulation lab and our counselor, Jessica Alvarado. This successful accreditation marks the 5th straight exemplary accreditation report for Health Professions in the last two years, including Respiratory Care, Physical Therapist Assistant, Paramedic National accreditation and Emergency Medical Technician State accreditation.

The College Reading and Learning Association has awarded Post-Secondary Education Tutor Training Program Certification to Lane's Tutoring Services Program. Certification was renewed at all three levels: regular, advanced and master through 2017. Tutoring Services coordinator **Liz Coleman** submitted a comprehensive portfolio documenting program components and said reviewers commented that the program looks strong, the training classes thorough, and the application itself was very organized. The CRLA outside review serves as part of program review and evaluation for Tutoring Services. Because the program and training is CRLA certified, Lane tutors who complete

training are recognized as CRLA tutors. That recognition has helped Lane students become employed as tutors at UO and other 4-year schools after their time at Lane.

Lane's Tutoring Services Program was first certified in 1999 at Level I and Level 2. Master level was added in 2007.
