About thirty high school students with interests in engineering and three teachers from Churchill High School had an opportunity to visit Lane Community College on January 11, 2013. They learned about opportunities ranging from High School Connections, Advanced Technology, Manufacturing Technology, Cooperative Education and Engineering. The two-hour visit generated many questions as well as excitement from these future students of Lane Community College.



More than 75 diesel mechanics from throughout the Willamette Valley attended a training in January

The training was held at Lane Community College and co-sponsored by the Lane Community College Diesel Technology Program and Oregon Trucking Association with the support of Detroit Diesel, Cummins, and MAC Trucks. On January 4, 2013, current and former staff and faculty commemorated the move to the new Downtown Campus with a Time Capsule Ceremony. Former instructor Lucille Lamoreaux handed a piece of carpeting from the old building to a current staff member. Others formed a human chain, passing the carpet hand to hand until it reached President Spilde, who placed it into the time capsule alongside duct tape, a rotary phone, and other items dating back to the first days of the college. The plaque on the time capsule, just outside the main doors, states that it is to be opened on Lane's 100th anniversary.

During his tour of the new Downtown Campus on February 2, 2013, Congressman Peter DeFazio visited with five current Senior Companion Program volunteers. The Congressman co-founded the Program, which has served frail elders and adults with disabilities nationwide for almost 40 years.
