Lane ESD has been awarded a \$455,208 grant from the Oregon Department of Education for the Lane Healthcare Pathways initiative. The award will enable grant partners, including Lane, to develop and implement an innovative, regional healthcare pathway of study. The pathway will include a two-year healthcare career evidence-based curriculum, extended internships, a hospital based teen volunteer program and a variety of healthcare career education opportunities for middle and high school students in nine districts including Bethel, Creswell, Crow-Applegate-Lorane, Junction City, Lowell, Oakridge, Pleasant Hill, South Lane and West Lane Technical Learning Center in Elmira.

Lane Community College will take an active role in the work through the efforts of three divisions: Health Profession, High School Connections, and Cooperative Education. Health Professions is leading the effort of the Teacher to Teacher (T2T) training in that will be offered this summer to help regional high school teachers gain the skills and experience necessary to teach College Now (dual credit) courses that apply to the Lane Community College Basic Health Care Certificate. High School Connections is involved in all of the College Now articulation processes related to the T2T training to determine who is available for the training and coordinate post training certification as College Now teachers.
