## **Academic Technology:**

Faculty Technology Specialist, <u>blogger</u>, and Writing Faculty member - Sandy Jensen - has recently completed two Digital Storytelling projects respectively with the <u>Center for Digital Storytelling</u> at Berkley and the <u>University of Mary Washington</u> online. Digital Storytelling is a method of online instruction that uses web 2.0 tools and remixed-media to construct online narratives. Sandy is working with her Academic Technology team to develop this evolving genre of online instruction here at Lane. Teacher-to-Teacher workshops on Digital Storytelling arrive in the Winter term. Academic Technology has recently launched the *Lane Knowledge Network* (LKN) to foster online collaboration and social-learning among faculty, staff, and students. The Knowledge-Network is a community blogging system that doubles as an internal social-network. The system is available to faculty, staff, and classes who would like to participate in peer-to-peer idea exchange and resource sharing. It is poised as an academic social-network. Early adopters include *International Students*, the *Honors program*, and the *Academic Technology* team .

A campus web site redesign is underway. Led by the Academic Technology Web Team and the Marketing Team, Lane is reinventing itself on the web with a distinct student-centric focus. The new site will include a substantial technical upgrade in the background and a substantial public facelift as well. The project is underway with employee, student, high-school, and community focus-groups now providing feedback and direction for the new site which is due to make an appearance in fall 2012.

In October, Continuing Education hosted the annual Oregon Community Education Association conference.
