SMALL BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT CENTER:

Lane Small Business Development Center (SBDC) recently obtained a portable assistance grant from the Small Business Administration to help fund continued business development assistance. The grant will also go to Linn-Benton Community College SBDC and Oregon SBDC Network, both of whom partnered in the proposal and helped obtain the grant. The year-long grant, awarded on October 1, will help businesses in distressed communities start, stabilize, grow and create jobs. Lane SBDC expects funds will help Advisor Megan O'Connor counsel a minimum of 60 clients in the targeted area and provide 250 counseling hours. She anticipates the initiation of ten new business startups and \$100,000

in new capital infusion.

Megan, who is the advisor/instructor for the Start, Run, Grow (SRG) Virtual Incubator program, brings a wealth of knowledge and immense enthusiasm to her new efforts. She explains, “With this funding, we will be able to focus efforts in rural communities, where rural chambers have been asking for assistance. The program currently serves the Eugene and Springfield areas. The project will target early-stage and small-established firms (1-9 employees) in rural Lane and Linn counties. I will provide entrepreneurial training and advising in Cottage Grove, Creswell, Florence, Junction City Lowell, Leaburg, Oakridge, the Fern Ridge Area and Vida.”

Lane hosted the annual ASPIRE Fall Conference for site coordinators and volunteers on Friday, October 3, 2014. A program administered by the Oregon Office of Student Access and Completion (OSAC), ASPIRE is a state-wide mentoring program that helps middle and high school students access education and training beyond high school. Students receive information about college and career options, admission, and financial aid from trained and supportive, ASPIRE volunteer mentors who work one-on-one with them at their schools throughout the year. ASPIRE is expanding their reach and Lane is about to become one of the first post-secondary ASPIRE sites in the state.
