Research in education has demonstrated that students gain multiple benefits from active engagement in classroom discussion, including:

- heightened learning and better understanding of course content
- · improved ability to communicate ideas and meanings clearly to varied audiences
- enhanced ability **synthesize** and **integrate** complex concepts and theories
- · improved capacity recognize and investigate your own assumptions
- · increased opportunity to understand and engage with a diversity of people and perspectives

In discussion, all class members should plan to help facilitate the **creation and**maintenance of this kind of community. Some people gain energy from speaking in class, while others find it takes energy to do so. Some people love talking in big groups while others prefer small groups. Some feel most confident communicating orally; others like the written form. In general, students benefit the most from a classroom environment in which they respect others' styles of communication while at the same time challenging themselves to participate actively and productively in discussion.
