



Prepare a perimeter master plan for LCC that uses the land as a resource to support the educational mission of the institution.






Precedent Studies

Collaborative Workshops


KEY IDEAS

- Consider revisions to campus core that improve civic structure




Community Survey

Sent to 14,000 emails; 1,454 completed surveys Would you consider living on or near campus?




Planning Vision




Preserves LCC Forest



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

Testing the Plan













- Campus quads improve wayfinding
 and accessibility
- On-campus housing reduces parking needs on campus
- Could reduce carbon emissions by over 1M pounds per year
- Up to 5.1 million sq. ft. of new buildings and over 2,000 new parking spaces
- Medians in roads and bioswales in parking lots allow paved surfaces to mitigate the stormwater they create

NEXT STEPS

- 1. Formally adopt the framework plan
- 2. Develop a public notice process (website, emails, etc.)
- 3. Appoint a Master Plan Team
- 4. Review short-term (bond) projects and resolve gaps
- 5. Reopen public process with campus community
- 6. Refine the preferred alternative
- 7. Prepare Draft Master Plan report
- 8. Prepare Prefinal Master Plan
- 9. Prepare Final Master Plan
- 10. Formally adopt the Final Master Plan



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
