Child Care Scholarship and Funding Assistance Programs

Lane Child and Family Center Funding Options

Lane Child and Family Center / Co-Op Option

Parents with children enrolled in the Lane Child and Family Center, on the main campus, may qualify for the Co-Op option. Parents participate in a wide array of duties (Co-oping) which reduces their child care fees. An approved Background Check is required. Contact Katheryn Blair @ 541-463-5794 for more information.

Lane Child and Family Center / Child Care Subsidy

Full or part-time students of Lane Community College with children enrolled in the Lane Child and Family Center for a minimum of 15 hours per week and who are taking a minimum of 6 credit hours on the main campus and are paying more than 60% of their child care costs themselves may qualify for a Child Care Subsidy. CAL/CCAMPIS GRANT (Child Care Access Means Parents In School)

Full or part-time students of Lane Community College with children enrolled in the Lane Child and Family Center for a minimum of 20 hours per week, who are Pell eligible, may qualify for the CAL/CCAMPIS Grant. Space is limited and given on a first come, first serve basis. Contact the Lane Child and Family Center office @ 541-463-5517 for more information and applications.

Child Care Assistance through Financial Aid

Students who qualify for Financial Aid may be eligible to receive additional funding to assist with child care expenses through Financial Aid. Students should complete the Child Care/Dependent Care Expense form available at the Financial Aid or Lane Child & Family Center offices. Completed form needs to be returned to the Financial Aid office to determine eligibility.

Other Oregon Child Care Assistance Programs:

ERDC (Employment Related Day Care)

Low income working families may be eligible for financial help with child care costs. ERDC is a subsidy program. This means eligible families still pay part of the child care cost. This amount depends on the family's income, size, and the amount the child care provider charges.
