BI 231 Human Anatomy and Physiology 1

Prerequisite: Grade of 'C-' or better in BI 112 / CH 112.

Foundational first course in anatomy/physiology. Topics include human body organization, histology and the integumentary, skeletal, articular, and muscular body systems; nervous system fundamentals and autonomic nervous system. Common clinical applications associated with these topics are presented.

Cooperative Education

Cooperative Education (Co-op Ed) is work-based learning where students learn skills related to their degree or major. Placements are usually off campus with non-profit organizations, private industry and governmental agencies. The worksite supervisor will orient, direct, instruct and evaluate the student's performance. The Co-op Ed coordinator will meet on site with the student's supervisor, discuss student performance and do a final evaluation at the end of the term. Students will evaluate their progress at the end of the experience. Acceptance is based on Co-op Ed coordinator consent and acceptance by the worksite. Each course may be taken for 3 - 12 credits.
