CLASSES

- Before leaving for Caen, you will take an online placement exam.
- Classes are offered at four levels of proficiency: A2, B1,
 B2, and C1. You will be placed according to your level.
- You will be in an international classroom, and taught by a native French teacher who is trained in FLES (français langue étrangère).
- Classes include: grammatical structures, vocabulary enrichment, phonetics, listening comprehension and oral skills. Students studying at the B1, B2, and C1 levels will also have classes in literature and civilization. (Total of 45 hrs instruction per week)
- Students in all levels will benefit from daily cultural enrichment activities (25 hrs per week)
- All students will take an overarching Lane course which will include a pre-departure orientation day on campus, reflection on the experience via regular blog entries, and a focus on intercultural learning.

COSTS

- Program Costs: \$3,500
 - Train to and from Caen
 - Bus and metro transit in Caen and Paris
 - Tuition and books
 - Homestay fees
 - Lodging in Paris
 - 4 day adult Paris Pass
 - Most meals
- Other expenses you should expect
 - Airfare 1,000-1,500 (Iceland Air can be cheaper!)
 - Some meals, incidentals: \$500
 - \$200 emergency cash
