Circling Home: Stories and Sustainable Communities

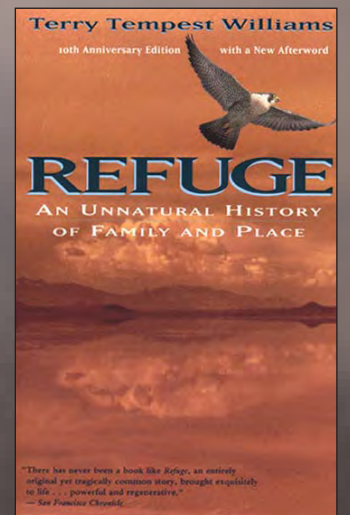
