PARKING ON CAMPUS

Typically, competition for parking spaces during the first two weeks of fall, winter and spring terms is at its highest. To avoid the stress of trying to locate a spot :

- Ride the bus
- Carpool
- If you must drive, plan to arrive early for classes or events
- Remember, overnight parking is allowed only by special arrangement with Public Safety.
- Disabled Parking spaces are available in lots A,B,C,D,E,L,N and between buildings 7 and 9. All persons with State-issued Disabled permits may use these spaces. Valid permits must be displayed.
- A Hybrid/Electric Charging Station is located in Lot B

CRIME PREVENTION

Follow these tips to reduce your chances of being a crime victim.

- Do not leave valuables in your car. If you must leave anything in your vehicle, lock it in the glove box or place it out of plain sight, preferably before entering campus.
- Eliminate any indication that your vehicle may contain valuables. Make sure that docking stations, connector cables, or computer-related items are out of sight.
- Remove face plates from after market stereos/CD players.
- Park in well-lit, high traffic areas.
- Lock all the doors and secure windows, including wing windows.
- Set any alarms or anti-theft device.
- Avoid using Hide-a-Keys. Thieves know the most popular hiding places.

If your vehicle is broken into, please notify Public Safety immediately at 541.463.5558 to make a report. Once the responding officer completes the report, it will automatically be forwarded to the Sheriff's office.

## BICYCLES

- Bicycles may be ridden only in areas specified for motor vehicle traffic.
- Bicycles may not be ridden on inner-campus areas as this poses a risk to pedestrians.
- Bicycles may not be ridden on the trails or non-paved areas of the campus.
- Bicycles should be secured in a bike rack with a secure lock.

## Reporting Emergencies on Campus

Need to report an emergency on campus? Public Safety will relay pertinent information to the emergency responders. This information typically includes:

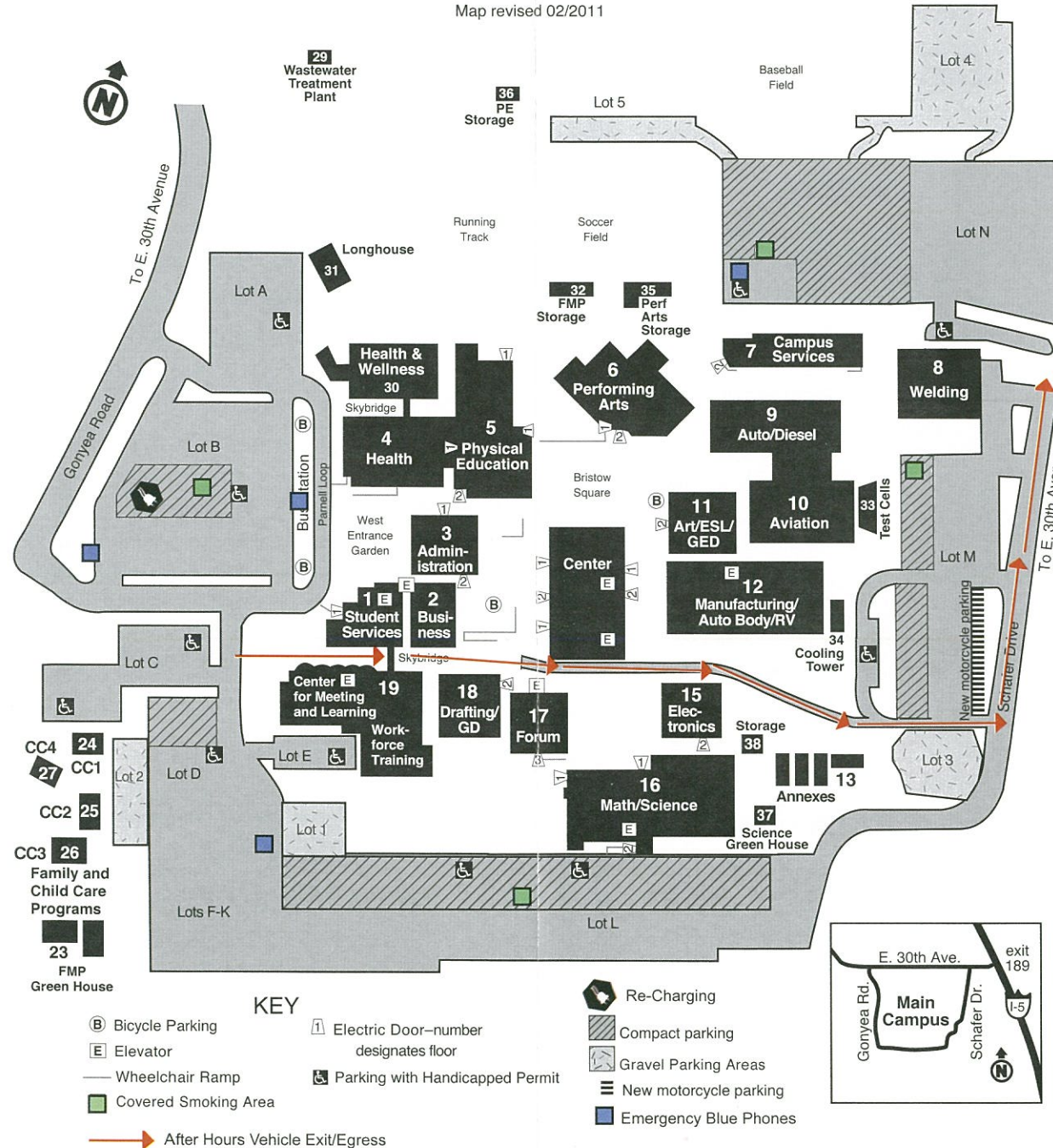
- Where the emergency is taking place, (be as specific as possible so help can arrive more quickly)
- The nature of the emergency
- A description of the suspect (s) (remember responders will have to positively identify this person)
- Any information regarding weapons or injuries

Stay on the line until the dispatcher disconnects with you.

## TOWING POLICY

Vehicles parked and/or left unattended in a location that impedes traffic or fulfills one of the following conditions, may be towed to an off campus location at the owners expense

- Owners of towed vehicles are responsible for violation fees, towing costs, and impound and storage fees.
- A vehicle will be towed if it restricts pedestrian and wheelchair routes
- A vehicle will be towed if it blocks or partially blocks a service drive, fire lane, or roadway
- A vehicle will be towed if it has been abandoned for five days.
- Vehicles left on campus more than 72 hours may be towed unless prior arrangements have been made with Public Safety.
- Vehicles blocking the Motorcycle Course in Lot N will be towed to an available spot in that lot at the owner's expense.
