PUBLIC SAFETY PROVIDES THESE FREE SERVICES:

- Campus lost and found
- · Campus key and key card issuance
- Alarm system monitoring for campuses
- · Patrol service including bike patrol
- · After hours entry assistance
- Emergency response
- Battery packs to assist motorists (bring identification to the Public Safety office to check out a pack)
- Safety escorts (please call 5-10 minutes prior to assure your request can be accommodated)
- · Parking enforcement
- Personal body alarms
- · CPR, Emergency First Aid
- Crime prevention presentations to various groups or organizations
- · Personal safety instruction

BICYCLES

Bicycles may only be ridden in areas specified for motor vehicles. Bicycles may not be ridden on inner areas of campus for reasons of pedestrian safety. Bicycles should be secured in a bike rack with a secure lock. Bicycles may not be secured to stairways or other parts of buildings, or stored

inside college buildings. Bikes may be registered with the Public Safety Department online. Visit www.lanecc.edu/psd and follow the links. Found or recovered bikes are impounded at Public Safety.

NON-MOTORIZED VEHICLES

The use of scooters, skateboards, roller skates, rollerblades and other similar items are strictly prohibited on all Lane Community College property. There is a \$20 fine for violating this policy.

Lane Community College does not assume any responsibility for lost/stolen bicycles or other items on college property.

KEYS AND KEY CARDS

- LCC policy prohibits the duplication or lending of issued keys
- Do not allow unauthorized persons to enter areas you have unlocked.
 If you lose a key, report it to Public Safety immediately
- Report lost or stolen Key Cards immediately to Public Safety at 541.463.5558
- Key Cards may not be transferred or loaned. Each card holder is personally responsible for her/his card
- Keycard replacement (lost cards) \$10

PARKING

Typically, competition for parking spaces during the first two weeks of fall, winter and spring terms is at its highest. To avoid the stress of trying to locate a spot:

- Ride the bus
- · Carpool with Zimride
- If you must drive, plan to arrive early for classes or events
- Stop at Public Safety to obtain a copy of the Parking Brochure. The brochure is also online at: www.lanecc.edu/psd/parking


SMOKING ON CAMPUS

Smoking and all other tobacco use is prohibited in all core areas of Lane's main 30th Avenue campus; smoking and tobacco use is allowed in four designated peripheral areas only. See map for designated areas. Smoking and other tobacco use is prohibited completely in all other Lane campuses and locations. If violated a \$25 fine will be issued.

GENERAL CRIME PREVENTION FOR STAFF

- Lock office doors, even when only leaving for a few minutes
- Avoid leaving keys or valuables in your office
- Do not prop open doors. If you find a door propped open, or notice anything suspicious, contact Public Safety at extension 5558

TIPS TO STAY SAFE

- Avoid taking shortcuts through isolated areas
- Avoid walking alone
- Be constantly aware of things going on around you. Walk with your head up, make eye contact with those you pass, and walk with a purpose
- When approaching your car, have your keys ready. Glance in and around your vehicle
- Safety escorts are provided at anytime for free. To obtain an escort call Public Safety at 541.463.5558
- Never leave valuables unattended It is best to leave unnecessary valuables/ money at home
- Engrave your driver's license or ID number on valuables
- When parking your vehicle on campus, secure all doors and windows and avoid leaving valuables in your car. If you must leave valuables in your car, lock them in the trunk
- · At night, park in well-lit areas
- Always report crime or suspected criminal activity
- AED (Automated External Defibrillator)
- Do not pet or approach any feral cats or other animals you may see on campus
