



Public Safety Officer Graduates Reserve Police Academy

Recently, an officer from LCC Public Safety Department graduated from the Reserve Police Academy, conducted by the Lane County Sheriff's Office. Officers were required to attend class Tuesdays,



Wednesdays and Saturdays. Academy courses included (not limited to) Oregon Criminal and Traffic Laws, Investigations, Patrol Procedures, Traffic Stops, De-

fense Tactics, Use of Less Lethal Weapons (pepper spray, baton and Taser) and Firearms. This training amounts to more than 330 hours.

Public Safety Officer Tyrel Sumich attended the academy on his own time, making personal sacrifices to successfully complete the training. Each year several Public Safety officers attend this additional training.

Participants that complete this training are eligible for

certification as a reserve police officer. Former and current Lane Community College Department of Public Safety officers have chosen to become reserve officers in their off time. LCC
