Chief's Note



Please remember, Parking Citations cannot be adjusted by officers after they are written! Follow the guidelines on the reverse of the ticket to appeal. Thanks! The Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) has scheduled another National Prescription Drug Take-Back Day which will take place on Saturday, April 27, 2013, from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. This is a great opportunity for those who missed the previous events, or who have subsequently accumulated unwanted, unused prescription drugs, to safely dispose of those medications.

Issue Volume

In the four previous Take-Back events, DEA in conjunction with our state, local, and tribal law enforcement partners have collected more than 2 million pounds (1,018 tons) of prescription medications were removed from circulation.

The National Prescription Drug Take-Back Day aims to provide a safe, convenient, and responsible means of disposal, while also educating the general public about the potential for abuse of these medications.

Shortly after DEA's first Take-Back Day event two years ago, Congress passed, and President Obama signed, the Secure and Responsible Drug Disposal Act of 2010, which amended the Controlled Substances Act (CSA), allowing DEA to develop permanent, ongoing, and responsible methods for disposal. Prior to the passage of the Disposal Act, the CSA provided no legal means for transferring possession of controlled substance medications from users to other individuals for disposal. On December 21, 2012, DEA published in the Federal Register a <u>Notice of Proposed Rulemaking for Disposal of Controlled Sub-</u> <u>stances</u>. These regulations would implement the <u>Secure and Responsible Drug Disposal</u> <u>Act of 2010 (Pub. L. 111-273)</u> by expanding the options available to collect controlled substances from ultimate users for purposes of disposal to include: Take-Back events, mailback programs, and collection receptacle locations.

However, until these regulations become permanent, DEA will continue to hold Take-Back Days.

LCC Public Safety has participated in this operation for three years, receiving several hundreds of pounds of unwanted/expired prescription medications.

This year, Public Safety Officers will be accepting prescription medications on April 27th, between the hours of 10 AM and 2 PM, in front of Building 19 (Center for Meeting and Learning).

Public Safety Recruit Academy

The Department of Public Safety is currently conducting an in-depth Training Academy to prepare new on call officers and cadets to better serve the campus community.

Successful recruits were submitted to multiple interview processes, written testing, rigorous background investigations and medical and physical examinations prior to being approved to attend the Academy.

Recruit officers are currently attending the Academy four days a week, then gaining on-the-job experience by accompanying veteran officers in the performance of their normal duties.





The Academy

is five weeks long and combines classroom/lab training and field training together to more efficiently learn the campus as well as proper procedures. Classroom and lab training focus on subjects such as campus rules and regulations, officer safety, Oregon law, investigative procedures, defense tactics, ASR (pepperspray) and baton use.

At the conclusion of the Academy, recruits will work with assigned Field Training Officers (FTO's) to complete their training in the field.

CAMPUSWIDE VIOLENT ACTOR (ACTIVE SHOOTER) TRAINING

The Public Safety Department is presenting a training session on what to do in case of a violent actor incident (specific emphasis on active shooters) on campus. The session is scheduled for Tuesday, April 23, at 3 p.m. and will be held in the Boardroom in Building 3. All staff, faculty, and students are invited to attend. Officer King has his GED and 90% of a business degree from Lane Community College as well as a degree in automotive technology from Wyotech Technical Institute located in Sacramento, CA.


Officer King began his employment with LCC Public Safety in early 2012. He is currently assigned as an on-call officer.
