War: Loss, Survival, and Reconciliation

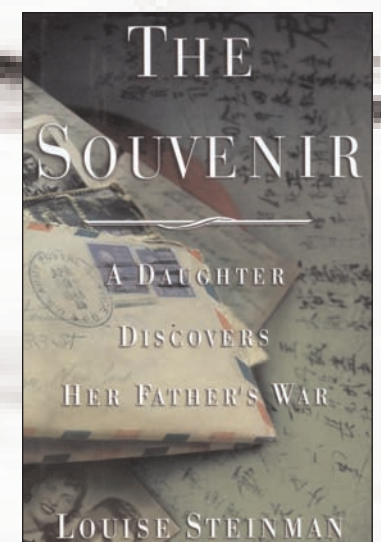
The Reading Together Project hosts an inspiring year of activities centered around two powerful books. We encourage Lane students, college staff, and members of the local community to read Tim O'Brien's novel about the Vietnam War, *The Things They Carried* and Louise Steinman's memoir, *The Souvenir: a Daughter Discovers Her Father's War*, involving a personal act of reconciliation between herself, as an American, and a family and town in Japan, 50 years after the end of World War II.

Reading Together invites you to participate in the community-building activities that will occur during fall, winter, and spring terms, 2007-08. Events will include a campus visit by the Reading Together author Louise Steinman, performing arts productions, art exhibits, workshops, guest speakers, forums, discussion groups, films, student presentations, service learning projects, course involvement and more.
