## Comments

An overwhelming majority of respondents felt Lane was doing a good job. Comments are grouped as follows: positive experience, jobs, quality, instructors, class size, suggestions, personal success and services.

# **Positive Experience**

- \* My experience at LCC was positive and a great start for me to get back into education.
- \* Lane is a great place and it feels like a community. It doesn't feel like an academic palace. I had a great learning experience.
- \* It was a good experience and helped prepare me for a university.
- \* Lane has the nicest grounds, and atmosphere of any community college I have visited. # Quality

- \* I believe the learning environment at Lane makes academic success very possible for almost anyone. I felt my teachers really cared about the success of each of their students. I think Lane offers a fairly wide variety of programs to choose from, but not so many that the quality of the programs suffers. The other students in most of my classes contributed to my learning through questions in class, and group work. I know that some of the facilities at Lane are older, and I am happy that updates and additions are taking place. ExpressLane was easy to use, though it took some time to transition to MyLane. Honestly, my experience at Lane was almost like a dream. I was able to achieve what I wanted, and I will definitely go back when I am ready to take classes again. #### Instructors

- \* Lane offers excellent instruction and preparation for transfer students that stay on track

### **Class Size**

- \* Nearly all of my teachers were excellent. Smaller class sizes were a huge plus to attending LCC for general ed. requirements. Thanks!
- \* The class sizes were surprisingly very small at Lane. This, I think is a very good thing. I felt Lane had a high quality in their teaching staff. Parking was always an issue however! The financial Aid was also very chaotic.

Overall, I had a mostly positive experience at LCC.

# **Suggestions**

- \* No MAC facilities (lab), classes, resource, or help, yet only computer sold in store. Otherwise, great teachers, campus and learning environment. Happy with experience with Lane and grateful for the education.
- \* No, if I could have gotten my degree at LCC I would have. They were really great.
- \* I had an overall good experience with LCC. The one thing I was not impressed with was the library accessibility. You should have the library open later in the evening and on weekends. I am very successful as a student over at U of O now, and LCC really helped me get prepared.
- \* Very impressed with the Math Resource Center available to students but I wish the operating hours were more flexible and open more evenings to accommodate everyone's schedule.
- \* I enjoyed my experience at Lane and couldn't have asked for a better experience. The two areas that I found very frustrating were the Financial Aid Department and lack of service and the Academic Advising was a major pain to meet with a counselor. They both were understaffed and need more people to assist students.
- \* Excellent teaching staff, help easily available. Placement tests made you start with classes that are too easy.
- \* Positive: Lane has good resources where students can take advantage of. Lane is a good place for environmentally friendly living. Lane Community College has some very good teachers with great knowledge, skills, motivational, and so on. Negative: It would be nice if Lane Community College had a bigger library and extended the library hours for students who take late night classes.

### **Personal Success**

- \* I was an older student when I first started at Lane (36 years old) and the Lane professors were perfect for me. I had the right amount of challenge combined with professors that really cared about my understanding of the subject material. I felt that everyone at Lane wanted me to succeed. Note: I did choose carefully who I took classes from. I have met a few professors that I feel should no longer be teaching and steered clear of them. The ExpressLane and MyLane sites were both easily navigable. The other students at Lane were always colorful and diverse. I was a lower division math tutor for a term and I admired Lane for the support given to those just starting their academic career. I also appreciated the free tutoring centers for myself. I often took advantage of them (writing, Spanish, upper division math) and felt that they were fundamental to my success in class. The most important thing for me was the support I received at Lane. I was a 9th grade dropout, and in order for me to move on academically I needed the support that I received to build confidence both academically and mentally to move on to the U of O. I'm in the business program there and it is challenging, but I'm doing it, and I'm doing it pretty well. I attribute that to all of you at Lane. Thank you.
- \* My time at Lane was like a transformation. I walked into the testing office with an eight grade education in 2005, today I am a senior at the U of O. I am still sometimes in awe of this. Lane is where I learned to believe in myself. I could have never accomplished this without the help and support from some very encouraging faculty members.
