- Nearly 38 percent (217) of all respondents and 51 percent (162) of career technical respondents had participated in Cooperative Education.
- Nearly 56 percent of all respondents who had participated in Cooperative Education indicated the *value* (Table 33) of their experience was "very good" and 58 percent indicated the *relevance* of their experience (Table 34) was "very good."
- Approximately 80 percent of all respondents who had participated in Cooperative Education indicated both the value and relevance of their experiences were "good" or "very good."

#### Interpretation/Analysis

Most respondents found their cooperative work experiences to be rewarding, both professionally and personally.

Four themes emerged from the comments about the Cooperative Education experience. Cooperative Education


- Prepared students for real-life jobs.

- Provided an enjoyable experience.







#### **Cooperative Education Comments**

Former Lane students commented that their Cooperative Education experiences:

#### **Prepared Respondents for Real-Life Jobs**

- \* My co-op experience was amazing! I learned a great deal about my area of study, and about working in an office. I feel that it was truly up to me to decide what I wanted to learn during my co-op education. That made the experience both more challenging and more rewarding.
- \* I believe the co-op experience that I had was priceless in terms of my education and experience for future career in this field.
- \* Co-op helped me gain confidence in my chosen field.
- \* Paramedic internship was critical to my skill development, and well handled.
- \* My co-op experience was very helpful. It helped me to gain experience in my field of study. I would say, it was one of the best parts in my experience at Lane.
- \* Co-op was the best part! Real world practice while at school.

### **Opened Doors to Jobs**

- \* Great program and led to a current job
- \* Ended up getting hired after internship
- \* The hands on experience was wonderful. They trusted me to have the skills necessary to "hit the ground running" which I did and It resulted in a position with the company after graduation. The amount of hours required within the time given was the only negative.
- \* The co-op served as essentially a job interview. Two weeks after it ended, I was offered a full time position at the company, even without completing the degree program.
- \* Good experience, work there now!
- \* Led me to my present job, very satisfied

# Helped both Lower Division Collegiate and Career Technical Respondents Find What Interested Them

- \* I succeeded in obtaining 2 degrees (accounting & admin. asst.) therefore I participated in two Cooperative Education Programs. Both gave me a better understanding of what I could expect in that field of business; it helped me decide which I preferred to work in.
- \* It is a good way to see what is expected from us when we look for a job in that field.

  Could be required a little bit earlier on in the coursework so you could do see sooner what you need to do and get a better idea if you want to actually go in to that field
- \* After my first term at LCC I decided I wanted to go into the Social Service field. I did 2 internships in that field + 1 as a high school soccer coach. It was extremely valuable to get that work experience in because I was able to sneak in the backdoor of the agencies I would not have been able to get in at otherwise aside from earning a degree in the field...and while there I discovered I didn't like the office environment or that field of work at ALL, so I totally changed my plans. So I'm very glad for that opportunity to intern through the Coop program.

#### Provided an Enjoyable Experience

- \* I had an extremely positive co-op experience. Very rewarding and learned a lot.
- \* Both placements were valuable in learning how the pros work, gaining experience, and getting to know people in the community.
- \* Extremely important as a nursing student as our clinical time was quite limited
- \* My co-op experience was great. It was very relevant to my career choice and study and I learned a lot while participating.
- \* Great experience and an important part of the program!

**A small percentage of respondents** expressed some disappointment and/or frustration with their Cooperative Education experiences as the following comments indicate:

- \* We were not given much help finding possible internships -- setting everything up, getting leads on which businesses would accept interns, etc.
- \* I was given a very passive role because of my non-employee status. Therefore my contribution was very marginal.
- \* Could have been more supervision
- \* The place was a great work environment and employed after the fact but the work didn't expand knowledge in the chosen field
- \* Would have appreciated more help from my co-op advisor in locating possible co-op positions. Ended up doing all of the legwork in finding positions that would give me some of the experience that I thought I would need in my chosen field.
