#### **EMERGENCY COMMUNICATION**

Emergency information will be announced by the Emergency Response Team to employees, students and the public using the LaneAlert emergency notification system. LaneAlert allows messages to be sent simultaneously to all registered users via text messaging, phone call, and/or email. All persons should keep their information current in the LaneAlert database by using the links in the "Home" tab on MyLane. Divisions and departments are responsible for notifying students in classrooms, laboratories, and other public spaces. "All Clear" announcements will be made when the situation is stabilized.

f you discover a medical emergency:  Avoid leaving injured/ill person except to summon help.  IF INJURY/ILLNESS IS SEVERE OR LIFE-THREATENING, CALL 911 FIRST.  Do not move person unless he/she is in danger.  Render first-aid or CPR if trained and qualified. Those trained will know the location and proper use of personal protective equipment necessary to avoid contact with potentially infectious body fluids.  A secondary call should be made to MJ at ext. 4805 or 541.480.8447 to notify her that emergency services has been called.  If exposed to another's body fluids, notify your supervisor and Human Resources. Immediately and seek treatment at Peace Harbor Hospital at 541.997.8412. Treatment needs to be within 2 hours of exposure.	Severe weather events could result in the college closing early, delaying opening or closing for one or more days.  A decision on a delay or closure will be made before 6:30 a.m. Staff and the community will be notified through LaneAlert text message and email in addition to local media (TV, radio, web).  IN THE EVENT OF SEVERE WEATHER CONDITIONS:  Actions to be taken in the event of severe weather will be announced by the Emergency Response Team through LaneAlert.  Radio and television news stations are informed of closures by the public information officer. Do not call KLCC-FM or other media; this interferes with their ability to announce the most current information. If media call you, refer them to the public information officer at ext. 5591.	If you discover a fire, call 911 immediately.  If fire is small and you have training, use an official fire extinguisher to combat the fire. Do Not Endanger Yourself or Others by trying to extinguish a large, well-developed fire.  If fire is beyond your means: pull a fire alarm. Help anyone in need of assistance. Contain the fire by closing, but not locking as many doors as possible. Evacuate the area.  A secondary call should be made to Public Safety ext. 5555 to notify them that emergency services has been called.  If you are notified of a fire in your building:  See EVACUATION  If you are above the ground floor and fire or dense smoke has restricted your exit routes: remain in your room. Place something at the base of your door to prevent the entrance of smoke. Call 911 and let them know your situation. Open windows and signal for help if possible.	<ul> <li>If evacuation order is issued, fully cooperate with Public Safety or evacuation messenger:</li> <li>Close but do not lock doors. If in an earthquake, leave doors open.</li> <li>If you are at a workstation, turn off all electronics, including computers.</li> <li>Evacuate in groups to ensure all are able to get out.</li> <li>Provide assistance for those with physical disabilities.</li> <li>Evacuate in a safe orderly manner to the designated meeting location for your building. Move away from building at least 500 feet, or 1.5 times the height of the building.</li> <li>As you evacuate, check store rooms, break rooms, etc. to ensure no one is left behind.</li> <li>Do not re-enter any building until declared safe by emergency authorities.</li> </ul>

Do Not Attempt to Apprehend or Interfere with a Criminal Except in Self Defense.

**BOMB THREAT** If you receive a bomb threat: Keep the person talking as long as possible (pretend to have difficulty hearing). Secure as much information as possible, such as: • Where is the bomb? • What type of bomb is it? • Why has it been planted? • What will make it explode? Sex of caller • When is it set to go off? • What does it look like? • Who planted it? • What is callers name? · Age of caller Note features of the callers' Note any background sounds. Note any specific threat or threatening language. Notes:

Record Caller ID displayed on telephone. If possible, hold the line open. **DO NOT HANG** 

Use another line to call Public Safety ext. 5555. Do not use cell phones or two-way radios. If you feel an earthquake:

**E**ARTHQUAKE

IF INSIDE, SEEK COVER IMMEDIATELY.

#### IF INDOORS -

### DROP, COVER, HOLD.

- DROP to the ground and get under a desk/table.
- **COVER** your head and neck with one arm.
- **HOLD** onto your table/desk with your other arm.

Stay put until the shaking has stopped.

Do not run out of the building.

If you are in a wheelchair, lock your wheels and cover your head.

#### IF OUTSIDE, STAY OUTSIDE.

- Move into an open area.
- Stay away from buildings, power lines, light posts, trees, etc.
- Sit down or kneel and cover yourself.

#### AFTER AN EARTHQUAKE

Beware of:

- Broken glass
- Hanging electrical lines (inside or outside)
- · Unstable equipment and debris

Call Facilities ext. 5216 if there is significant damage to your building. Call 911 if anyone is hurt.

Check on fellow employees and students.

Aftershocks may occur. Remain alert and be prepared to seek cover.

#### **T**SUNAMI

If tsunami sirens sound, go to designated evacuation area.

Do not head toward beach.

# If you discover a chemical

CHEMICAL SPILL

Immediately inform all in the area to leave the area.

If the chemical comes into contact with any person:

- Remove all contaminated clothing.
- · If there is contact with a person's eyes, rinse eyes with water for at least 15 minutes.
- If there is contact with a person's skin, thoroughly rinse under water and then wash with soap and water.

Call Public Safety ext. 5555 and inform them of the type and amount of chemical spilled so that they may inform specialized authorities.

DO NOT CLEAN UP ANY CHEMICAL SPILL ON YOUR OWN without permission.

# VIOLENT OR THREATENING BEHAVIOR

First, ensure safety of yourself and those around you. Do not meet with person threatening or posing an obvious danger.

#### VERBAL ABUSE:

- Remain calm. Try to calm the person down.
- Listen. Tell the person you are willing to help.
- If no response, get attention of someone around you.
- If situation escalates or there is immediate threat, call Public Safety ext. 5555.
- If necessary, leave your workspace.
- · For consultation on student crisis call Counseling ext.

# PHYSICAL AGGRESSION:

- Do not engage the physically aggressive person. Leave workspace immediately. Go to a location with other people.
- Advise manager and staff.
- Call 911.

# **HAZARDOUS MATERIALS** ACCIDENT

Departments or divisions that use or handle hazardous materials must have MSDS readily available. All hazardous materials must be properly labeled.

Unless properly trained, do not attempt to clean up the hazardous spill. Call Facilities Management ext. 5216.

If a gas cylinder or other chemical container leaks, and you believe this is dangerous:

- Call Public Safety, ext. 5555.
- Confine the fumes or fire by shutting door to the room.
- Cease all operations.
- Do Not Switch Lights or ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT ON OR OFF.

Do Not sound the building fire alarm. Electrical arcing can trigger an explosion.

Begin **Evacuation** procedures.

If notified of a gas leak in your area, **EVACUATE**.

- · Leave belongings behind
- · Keep your hands visible
- If outside, go to nearest campus parking lot and get as far away as possible. DO NOT ENTER A **BUILDING**. Building entrances will be secured.

### 2. HIDE/SHELTER IN PLACE

- Hide in an area out of the active shooter's view
- If possible, go to your designated safe room
- Block entry to hiding place and lock doors
- Turn off lights
- Silence phones

#### 3. FIGHT/TAKE ACTION

As a last resort and only when your life is in imminent danger:

- Attempt to incapacitate the active shooter
- Act with physical aggression and throw items at the active shooter

### 4. IMPORTANT ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

**ACTIVE SHOOTER** 

- Building entrances will be locked electronically during this emergency.
- Law Enforcement goals will be to put pressure on the suspect until he surrenders, is eliminated, or kills himself.
- All Clear notification will come from Lane Alert or the Public Address System.
- Law Enforcement will not give medical assistance until the threat has been eliminated.

- Avoid contact with potentially infectious human body fluids. Remember: if it is human, wet and it isn't yours – don't touch it.
- Wear protective gloves when assisting someone in a situation where you could become exposed to bloodborne pathogens.
- Call Facilities at ext. 4832 and request a BBP clean up for any spilled blood or body fluids – they have been specially trained. Do not clean up potential BBP situations yourself.

#### IN CASE OF EXPOSURE:

- Notify your supervisor.
- Notify Human Resources.
- If exposed to another's body fluids, notify your supervisor and Human Resources. Immediately and seek treatment at Peace Harbor Hospital at 541.997.8412. Treatment needs to be within 2 hours of exposure.
