- 1. We began the meeting with a look at the Strategic Learning Initiative Charter. Great additions and revisions were made and the group decided that Susie should work on some formatting and additions that were talked about and resend out to the group for final additions or revisions. **It was suggested to use track changes** option in word (under tools) so that we could see the our progress.
