### 1. Welcome and Introductions

# 2. Updates and Announcements

- Sustainability Plan Vision Session: Claudia reminded attendees that this will be on Monday, February 13, 2012 from 2:30-5:30 pm in CML 220. She encouraged Committee members to invite others.
- Water Management Class Project: Sarah announced that the Water Management Class that she teaches will be working on a draft Water Management Plan for LCC. Sarah would like for her class to interview stakeholders in March. Sarah will send an invitation to the Committee inviting us to participate in the interviews.
- Science Division Using Rechargeable Batteries: Rosie announced that the Science Division has switched from disposable batteries to rechargeable and are saving a lot of battery waste. Mike pointed out that rechargeable batteries must be recycled because they contain hazardous waste.

# 3. Taking Back the Tap

Attendees debriefed the "Take Back the Tap" table at the Health and Wellness Fair. Over 70 employees signed the pledge to not drink bottled water. Dave noted that water quality testing was done in all campus buildings in 2011 and that results were good. No contaminants above allowed levels were found. Members discussed next steps and came up with the following:

- Claudia and Rosie will post a pledge sign in the Science Hallway asking students to sign it and make the pledge.
- Jennifer will work on a series of Lane Weekly announcements to include topics like quality of Lane water, amount of petroleum used, plans to eliminate of bottled water sales.
