2. Updates and Announcements:

- Sustainable Purchasing Subcommittee: Rachelle reported that the Sustainable Purchasing Subcommittee met before break and came up with a plan to further research sweatshop free policies and to meet with Office Max regarding options for improving sustainability with our contract with them. The subcommittee will be meeting again next week.
- *IPCC Report*: Margaret reported that new Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change reports have recently been released, specifically, the Working Group 1 and 2 contributions to the Fifth Assessment Report. Paul noted that the Working Group 3 report will be out next month. Paul summarized some of the findings in the reports:
 - The evidence that human-caused climate change is occurring is overwhelming.
 - Things are happening faster than predicted in the last report. New predictions include:
 - A 2 meter sea level rise by the end of the century, as opposed to a 1 meter rise predicted in the last report.
 - No sea ice in the artic in the summer within 6 years.
 - Famine and water rationing issues.
 - Water riots were identified as a critical threat.

Jennifer will order the full report for the sustainability library once it comes out as a book.

- Peace Symposium: Stan encouraged committee members to attend and to help spread the word about the annual Peace Symposium which will be happening in the longhouse on April 25 & 26, 2014. The theme for the event is "Awakening the Dreamer → Move to Action." The symposium will focus on the destructive dream of the modern world that happiness is rooted in endless consumption, oppression of marginalized peoples, endless war and corporate control of politics and the economy.
