COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Adult Basic and Secondary Education

Students will develop specific reading strategies to build core reading skills. The course includes instruction in word attack skills, locating the main idea, and supporting details in paragraphs and in short readings. Students who satisfactorily achieve competencies of the course will have skills to achieve a score necessary to enter specific credit classes. Students will need to attend an orientation and testing session before they can be enrolled in Adult Basic and Secondary Education classes.

Academic Learning Skills

RD087, Preparatory College Reading (3 credits).

Students will learn active reading strategies, such as finding the main idea and supporting details to improve textbook comprehension. Students will develop techniques for enlarging vocabulary and creating study tools. Reading selections from actual first-year textbooks are part of the course.

EL115R Effective Learning. (3 credits)

Enroll in this course in combination with a specific RD087 section. This course is designed for students who wish to strengthen study skills and strategies. Students will learn how to take notes from lectures and textbooks, use their preferred learning styles, study for tests, improve memory, read and study from textbooks, manage time effectively, use the library and make visual study tools.

EL115, Effective Learning (3 credits).

This course is designed for students who wish to strengthen their study skills and strategies. Students will learn how to take notes from lectures and text books, use their preferred learning styles, study for tests, improve memory, read and study from textbooks, manage time effectively, use the library, and make visual study tools. Course requires college-level reading skills.
